- A) Why Are We Here? – "Although our minds told us that we would never make it, the people in the Fellowship gave us hope by insisting that we could recover."
- B) How It Works – "If you are like us you know that one is too many and a thousand never enough. We put great emphasis on this, for we know that when we use drugs in any form, or substitute one for another, we release our addiction all over again."
- C) Recovery & Relapse - "We can never fully recover, no matter how long we stay clean. Complacency is the enemy of members with substantial clean time."

- A) Step 1 – "It never occurred to us to ask, "If we can't control our addiction, how can we control our lives?" We felt miserable without drugs, and our lives were unmanageable."
- B) Steps 4 & 5 - "A basic rule of thumb is that we can write too little, yet we can never write too much. The inventory will fit the individual."
- C) Steps 8 & 9 - "At the same time, we cannot put off completion of this step just because we are not sure that our list is complete. We are never finished."
